

Mayor Fred Froehlich called the Public Hearing of 2023 Infrastructure Improvements of the City of Nicollet to order at 6:00 p.m., in the City Garage on December 8, 2022.

In addition to Mayor Froehlich; Council members: Mary Wels, Tom Rieke and Phil Radel were present. Councilmember Matt Anthony was absent. Members and guests recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

The purpose of the public hearing was to hear the plans on the 2023 Infrastructure Improvements.

City Engineer Joe Duncan and Eric Hauser discussed each of the phases of the project and provided a preliminary assessment roll according to the City Policy:

- Alley South of 6<sup>th</sup> Street between Pine Street & 300 feet east of Elm Street
- Alley north of 3<sup>rd</sup> Street between Hopp Avenue & Main Street
- Burg Avenue
- Alley east of Burg Avenue south of 1<sup>st</sup> Street

The property owners had specific questions for their property assessment and the specific work for their property. The concerns by most of the property owners of Burg Avenue were: why is the farmer not being assessed for the storm water repairs and who made the decision to have the alley north of 3<sup>rd</sup> Street between Hopp Avenue and Main Street. Owners of alley south of 6<sup>th</sup> Street concerned about trees being removed from the park in order to blacktop the alley, asking if the alley will have a speed zone, how long will the project last and will their driveway entrance be paved.

*RESOLUTION #12-08-22 – To Order Imp. And Prepare Plans for the 2023 Infrastructure Improvements was approved on a motion made by M. Wels, which was seconded by P. Radel, and which carried with all voting in favor.*

*With no further business, the public hearing was adjourned at 7:28 p.m., which was approved on a motion made by M. Wels, which was seconded by T. Rieke, and which carried with all voting in favor.*
